DESCRIPTION

Health and Safety is one of the most essential, important aspects in the construction industry. Safety Coordinators are responsible for planning, implementing and overseeing company's employee safety at work. Their main duty is to ensure that the company is in compliance and adheres to Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) guidelines to reduce work-related injuries.

SKILLS

- Good communication, interpersonal and problem-solving skills
- Ability to present and conduct training
- Excellent knowledge of potentially hazardous materials or practices
- Work independently and take on responsibilities ensuring issues are resolved
- A thorough working knowledge of current Health and Safety legislation

DUTIES

- Carry out Health and Safety audits and inspections required to cover all work activities
- Conduct training courses following procedures and formats that meet regulations
- Investigate accidents and complete audits as required
- Inspect workplace to ensure all equipment, materials and product processes do not present a safety issue
- Maintain an up to date knowledge of new legislation on Health and Safety Matters

EDUCATION

- A high school diploma is required
- A diploma in Occupation Health and Safety or related discipline
