

ROOFER (RESIDENTIAL)

DESCRIPTION

A roof, like walls and a foundation, are an integral part of a house. Roofers install, repair or replace flat roofs and shingles, shakes or other roofing tiles on sloped roofers. Roofers/Shinglers may also waterproof basements, foundations and decks.

SKILLS

- Thrive in team dynamics, some leadership ability required
- Able to perform heavy manual labour for prolonged periods of time
- Read and interpret documents, work with numbers to perform calculations
- Problem solving skills to provide solutions to challenges
- Comfortable working with heights

DUTIES

- Install, repair or replace roofing systems using materials such as asphalt and gravel
- Install, repair or replace shingles and other roofing tiles
- Apply waterproof coating to concrete surfaces
- Install and repair metal roofs using hand and power tools
- Install scaffolding to provide safe access to roofs
- Estimate required materials and costs

- Completion of high school
- Apprenticeship program
- Roofing is a voluntary trade in Ontario
